There were 14 of us. It was a snowy day, but I don't think anyone canceled due to snow.


Since it was a quiet day, we got over a half hour in front of one of the radar scopes, with two of Bradley's finest showin' us the works. I for one was very surprised at the level of traffic on the scope, on a snowy Saturday morning with absolutely zero VFR traffic. Sure, many of 'em were in the flight levels, but it really brings the reality home: we fly in one of the busiest airspaces in the world. I can now appreciate just how busy these guys get on the nice weather weekends when we're all criss-crossing their airspace.

One note: the controllers definitely encouraged us to be talking to 'em while we're in their airspace. Sure, they may get grumpy sometimes (their words) but they would rather be talking to us in their airspace than not. Even with the snow falling, there were a steady stream of arrivals and departures, competing with the snow plows for the active runway. From the tower cab, you couldn't see the arrivals until the wheels were down.



I could go on and on...but the Museum deserves a few words. We lucked out at the Museum.

Upcoming NDB and VOR Change?

AOPA is reporting a couple of significant changes coming to the local area. The bottom line is that we may be loosing many of the NDB approaches in the area, along with the Hartford and Bradley VORs, and all the Approaches, Airways and Intersections based on those facilities.

The Bradley and Providence VORs are both going to be disturbed by airport construction plans. The FAA is proposing that the VORs be decommissioned. AOPA reports that these VOR's support 10 airways and 16 approaches in the area.

March 3rd Meeting Report

The March 3rd WAPA meeting was held at Artie's Restaurant in Spencer. 18 members attended and we had a great time, company and food.

Amos Heckendorf had WAPA name tags made up for everyone, a great idea to help members get to know each other. Steve Fogarty gave a review of his planned fly-out events. Future trips will include a Northern NE trip, Owls Head, and Old Rheinbeck. George Clark delivered the Communications Committee report.

Communications Committee Report

The communications committee recommended a number of actions to help foster communications within our pilot community. Some of the upcoming changes include:

- We will be bulk-registering everyone into the WAPA Website. This will automate some of our communications through the use of the online newsletter. Unless you are already registered, your user name will be the concatenation of FirstLast names. Password will be generated with a "catchy phrase" to help you remember it.
- We have set up a "Secure" section on the web, and will post everyone's contact information Names,
 Addresses, Phone Numbers, etc. This will only be visible to paid WAPA members. If you want to opt-out, contact george@worcesterapa.org
- In order to encourage more member-to-member communications, the unicom email list has been changed to automatically direct replies back to the mailing list.

Note: If do not want to receive the potentially increased volume of email, we can change your subscription to a "daily digest" format instead of individual messages.

 The idea of a drawing to encourage web submissions was raised. Dewey Sasser made a motion to approve a \$25/quarter gift certificate drawing for web contributions. It passed without objection.

Aviation Scholarship

There was considerable discussion of the Scholarship, and the lack of progress in finalizing the award. Steve Fogarty took the floor to bring the scholarship discussion to a decision. Steve called for a number of votes in succession.

- To restrict the scholarship to age 25 and under.
 Motion failed.
- To restrict the scholarship grant to age 20 and under. Motion **passed** with 10 for out of 18.
- To split the scholarship into two parts, one part to go to a college scholarship the other to be used for initial flight training: Motion **failed**; 9 members in favor of all for initial flight training, 7 members for split.
- To require students to pay for 2 hours for each 1 WAPA pays for: Motion **failed**. 3 members for.

The following were all passed by acclamation without count.

- To provide the funds as a 1:1 match for instruction paid for by the grantee.
- To restrict the maximum grant to any 1 person to \$1000
- To require the grantee to have successfully passed the written exam
- To require the grantee to have a valid medical

"This was my first WAPA event - I flew up with Alex Kittenplan in his Tiger, and it was a really great time. I think it was 14 people arriving in 8 or 9 planes. We couldn't have asked for a better VFR day and the restaurant was a great breakfast spot.

I met a nice bunch of guys and the conversation on flying and (occasionally) other subjects was a lot of fun.
