Who may participate? Pilots holding a private certificate or higher. In addition, completion of the "WINGS" program satisfies the requirements of FAR 61.56 (Flight Review). Be in touch with your strengths and weaknesses. **What are the requirements?** Attend an FAA sponsored safety seminar and receive 3 hours of flight instruction; an hour each on: take offs and landings, instrument flying, and basic airwork. All requirements must be completed within a 12-month period. Every 12 months, you can achieve another phase of the "WINGS" program. The requirements are the same for each phase. Receive a set of "WINGS" and a certificate for each phase. Consult Advisory Circular 61-91H for details.

## ARE YOU READY FOR SUMMER FLYING? Remember it is not quite summer yet.

- ✓ Allow sufficient time for thorough preflight planning
  - ✓ Give yourself a multitude of options
  - ✓ Review your pilot's operating handbook
- ✓ Dress so that you can conduct a thorough preflight and remember that it still gets cold at night.
  - ✓ Remove all frost from aircraft surfaces prior to flight
- ✓ Taxi speeds must be consistent with conditions, and use appropriate control inputs for the wind velocity and direction.
  - ✓ Review aircraft performance numbers very carefully, remember at the outside temperature rises, your aircraft performance degrades
    - ✓ Use all available weather sources both before and during flight
      - ✓ Are you prepared for survival options?
      - ✓ File and activate a flight plan, use ATC flight following!
    - ✓ Tell someone where you are going, and when you should be back
- ✓ Have a healthy respect for weather, no matter what sort of equipment you operate.
