**Who may participate?** Pilots holding United States Pilot Cert. at all Certificate levels, including: airplanes, seaplanes, rotorcraft, gliders, lighter than air, light sport and ultralights. **Why participate?** Regular proficiency training is essential to the safety of all pilots. In addition, completion of the "WINGS" program satisfies the requirements of FAR 61.56 (Flight Review). Be in touch with your strengths and weaknesses. **What are the requirements?** 

For the current phase based program: Attend an FAA sponsored safety seminar <u>and</u> receive 3 hours of flight instruction; an hour each on: take offs and landings, instrument flying, and basic airwork. All requirements must be completed within a 12-month period. Every 12 months, you can achieve another phase of the "WINGS" program. The requirements are the same for each phase. Receive a set of "WINGS" and a certificate for each phase. Consult Advisory Circular 61-91H for details. This program will end Dec. 31, 2007.

The New Wings Program started June 1, 2007 and you are eligible to participate in both programs until Dec.31, 2007. - ✓ Allow sufficient time for thorough preflight planning
  - ✓ Give yourself a multitude of options
  - ✓ Review your pilot's operating handbook
- ✓ Look over your aircraft weight and balance computations.
- ✓ Review aircraft performance numbers very carefully, density altitude can kill you
  - ✓ Use all available weather sources both before and during flight
    - **✓** Review carburetor ice procedures
      - ✓ Plan letdowns wisely
    - ✓ Are you prepared for survival options?
    - ✓ File and activate a flight plan, use ATC flight following!
  - ✓ Tell someone where you are going, and when you should be back
  - ✓ Have a healthy respect thunderstorms, no matter what sort of equipment you operating.
