lighter than air, and ultralights. **Why participate?** Regular proficiency training is essential to the safety of all pilots. In addition, completion of the "WINGS" program satisfies the requirements of FAR 61.56 (Flight Review). Be in touch with your strengths and weaknesses. **What are the requirements?** Attend an FAA sponsored safety seminar and receive 3 hours of flight instruction; an hour each on: take offs and landings, instrument flying, and basic airwork. All requirements must be completed within a 12-month period. Every 12 months, you can achieve another phase of the "WINGS" program. The requirements are the same for each phase. Receive a set of "WINGS" and a certificate for each phase. Consult Advisory Circular 61-91H for details.

ARE YOU READY FOR SUMMER FLYING?

Remember things are different with the three H. H. H.

- ✓ **Hazy:** Restricted visibility and reduced performance, my advice, give yourself a multitude of options.
- ✓ **Hot:** Review your pilot's operating handbook.
- ✓ **Humid:** Takes its toll on the human performance as well as the aircraft.
- ✓ **Physical condition,** stay hydrated, drink plenty of water.
- ✓ **Review aircraft performance numbers** very carefully.
- ✓ **It its the season for Thunderstorms,** avoid them by 20 miles, use all available weather services including TV, Radio, DUAT, Flight Service @ 1-800-992-7433 and En-Route Flight Advisory Service, AKA Flight Watch at 122.0 MHZ.
- ✓ **Use all available weather sources** both before and during flight.
- ✓ **Are you prepared for survival options?** Bring a survival and first aid kit with you.
- ✓ **File and activate a flight plan,** use ATC flight following!
- ✓ **Tell someone where you are going,** and when you should be back.
