ARE YOU READY FOR SPRING FLYING?

Well we are not quite there, please remember to:

Allow sufficient time for thorough preflight planning

✓ Give yourself a multitude of options

- ✓ Review your pilot's operating handbook
- ✓ Dress so that you can conduct a thorough preflight
- ✓ Remember there is much less daylight flying time available
- Allow time for preheating, or better yet, store the aircraft in a hangar overnight for early departures
 - ✓ Remove ALL snow, ice, & frost from aircraft surfaces prior to flight
 - ✓ Taxi speeds must be consistent with conditions (watch out for snowbanks!)
 - Review aircraft performance numbers very carefully
 - ✓ Use all available weather sources both before and during flight
 - ✓ Review carburetor ice procedures
 - ✓ Plan letdowns wisely
 - ✓ Landing surfaces might be treacherous
 - ✓ Are you prepared for survival options?
 - ✓ Do you have a carbon monoxide detector?
 - ✓ Have a healthy respect for ice, no matter what sort of equipment you operating.
